


# VISITOR'S TAX: A CONTRIBUTION TO MAINTAIN THE BEAUTY OF THE CITY



The visitor's tax, introduced by the Municipality of Padua (with Town Council resolution n. 324 27/06/2011) will come into force as of the 1st of September 2011.

The tax will be allocated to finance interventions in the tourism sector which will include support to accommodation facilities and the management, maintenance, and renovation of cultural and natural heritage sites in addition to local public services.

## Who pays the tax?

Everyone who spends one or more night in one of the accommodation facilities within the city limits.

## To whom do I pay the tax?

The tax is paid to the owner/manager of the accommodation facility who will provide a receipt of payment.

## How much is due?

The tax due is per person per night up to a maximum of 5 consecutive nights.

## Who is exempt from the tax?

- persons resident in Padua;
- children under 16 years of age;
- persons who sleep in youth hostels or in structures which belong to the Municipality of Padua;
- sick persons (together with one assistant) who have to undergo treatments at health facilities within the city limits;
- persons who assist in-patients in health facilities situated within the city limits (one assistant per patient);
- parents, guardians or certified assistants who accompany in-patient children under 18 years of age in health facilities situated within the city limits (maximum of two persons per patient);
- non self-sufficient disabled persons, with medical certificates, and their assistant;
- coach drivers and one tour guides of tour groups organized by official travel agencies (every driver and tour guide per 25 persons);
- state and local policemen as well as firemen who stay overnight for work reasons.
